#### Thanksgiving for Baptism


P: Blessed be the holy Trinity, + one God, the wellspring of grace, our Easter and our joy.



#### John 10:11-18

The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. <sup>12</sup>The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away — and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. <sup>13</sup>The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. <sup>14</sup>I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, <sup>15</sup>just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. <sup>16</sup>I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. - A: Living God, we give thanks for our ancestors in faith and all who labored to help generations understand the good news of the gospel. Strengthen us to share the good news in our own day. God of grace,




- All are welcome at Christ's table.






deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen

P: The risen Christ is made known to us in the breaking of the bread. Come and eat at God's table.




